Sharing One's Faith (1 Credit)

Course Description

Sharing One's Faith will examine how Lutheran Christians understand Scripture. Participants will explore and practice teaching methods for use with youth in small group Bible Studies as well as ways to share one's faith through the rhythm of daily life.

Workshop Objectives

- An understanding of the basics of Lutheran theology
- Knowledge of ways to share one's faith
- Working ability to lead small group Bible studies
- Working ability to plan and lead worship

Workshop Requirements

Students will be involved in planning and leading worship and small group Bible study. They will write 1-2 page paper demonstrating how they shared their faith in the camp setting, to include specific relational ministry experiences.

Experiential Learning in a Camp Setting (1 Credit)

Course Description

Students will discover how to work with youth and adults in large and small group settings. An emphasis will be placed on understanding individual and cultural differences. Practical experience in conflict management will be offered.

Workshop Objectives

- An understanding of the developmental stages of youth
- An understanding of the individualized needs of youth with developmental or physical disorders requiring special attention and techniques
- An understanding of group dynamics, large and small group facilitation, team building
- An understanding of cultural differences
- An understanding of personality types and their implications in a group setting
- Techniques of conflict management

Workshop Requirements

Students will write 1-2 page paper demonstrating how knowledge of special needs was used with a particular camper or group of campers or how large and small groups were facilitated using team building and conflict management.

Physical Education

Health and Recreation in an Outdoor Setting (1 Credit)

Course Description

Students will learn the necessary skills for safe camping to include risk management, first aid and CPR. They will learn how to involve campers in outdoor recreation activities such as water activities, horsemanship, backpacking and biking. These activities will vary from site to site.

Workshop Objectives

- Working knowledge of
- Camping skills and low impact camping techniques
 - Risk Management
 - Standard first aid and CPR
 - Group dynamics and team building activities
 - Game leading techniques
 - ACA standards for health, safety and care of campers
 - Environmental concerns
 - Site specific outdoor recreation activities

Workshop Requirements

Students will write a 1-2 page paper demonstrating how specific health and safety skills and outdoor recreation activities were incorporated into the weekly camping experience.
